Kiski Astronomers at Cherry Springs - April, 2014

Hi all,

Bob K and I made our 1st trip of the year to Cherry Springs. Over the winter, I purchased a new camper, A Tab Clamshell, and I wanted to break it in on a short trip.

Thursday 424/2014:

I took the long way to the park, sticking to the interstate until I got use to how the new trailer towed. (had to have a brake controller installed for the electric brakes, and I needed to tweak the settings on the drive). Once at the I80 DuBois Rt 255 exit, I went back to the usual scenic drive up thru Elk country. It was interesting, being able to follow the contour of the land, as most of the trees had yet to leaf-out.

The steep brown hills made a colorful contrast against the dark blue skies.

I arrived mid-afternoon, and setup next to Bob K, who had been there for about an hour. We had to move over a row, as the power was out in our normal 'Kiski' location on the observing field. Several folks from the Hidden Hollow club had been there for several days already, along with Gary H and a few others. All told, probably about a dozen of us there. The 'iffy' weather forecast for the weekend held back a number of folks from attending.

Later in the evening, with the constellation of Hydra hitting the meridian, I slewed the telescope over to M83. There's an interesting article in the May 'Sky&Tel' on the HII star-forming regions in that galaxy which are visible in amateur telescopes. With a little post-processing back at home, I was able to match a number of regions to the picture from the article. I think I could have seen them even better if M83 had a higher elevation in the sky. While I was chasing down galaxies, Bob spent the evening trying out a new field-flattener. The sky was beautifully clear till about 1:30am, when the clouds began building along the horizon. By 2:30am, it was all over, so we covered up the telescopes and went to bed.
